



The first newspaper in Indian history:

The newspaper in India was first published on 29th January 1780 by James Augustus Hicky under the British Raj. Its name was "the Bengal Gazette" or Calcutta General Advertiser, generally known as the "Hicky's Gazette". The period was portrayed by strict government control and restriction. The British Government forced severe observation on the print media. The year 1857 is known as the development year of reporting in India. This year is set apart by the division of Indian press and British press and because of the Vernacular Press Act of 1876. In 1861 the principal version of "The Times of India" was published by Robert Knight. Again in 1868, "Amrit Bazar Patrika" was begun; this newspaper fundamentally engaged with the social reformers and political pioneers and began contributing to the field of news-casting.




